27th UNAFF Visionary Award Honors Matthew Modine

The <u>27th United Nations Association Film Festival</u> (UNAFF) presents award-winning filmmaker, actor, author, photographer, political activist, and environmentalist **Matthew Modine** with the annual **Visionary Award.** Modine has produced impactful documentaries, two of which bookend this year's festival, highlighting critical social and environmental issues. He is also the founder of Bicycle for a Day (BFAD), an initiative that empowers individuals with the knowledge to reduce consumption and live more sustainably.

UNAFF is honored to recognize Matthew Modine for his decades of dedication to protecting our oceans and advancing human rights. He joins an esteemed list of previous Visionary Award recipients, including Academy Award winner and United Nations Messenger of Peace Michael Douglas; Congresswoman Barbara Lee; human rights activist, actor, and singer Harry Belafonte; singer and activist Joan Baez; Academy Award nominee and women's rights advocate Dorothy Fadiman; Silicon Valley pioneers William Draper III and Franklin "Pitch" Johnson; philanthropist Juliette Feeney-Timsit; and former United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon.

Opening Night begins with <u>MATTHEW MODINE'S RIPPLE EFFECT</u>, a short film for a proposed documentary series that follows extraordinary people making bold attempts to save the planet. It screens at the Mitchell Park Community Center in Palo Alto, on **Thursday, October 17**, after Mayor Greer Stone gives the opening remarks.

Closing Night is concludes the festival with another Modine-produced film. **SLUDGE: A PFAS UPRISING** tells stories of farmers who speak up about "forever chemicals" poisoning their land, water, and livestock and ruining their livelihoods. The short film, directed by Jeffrey Christian and produced by Matthew Modine and Adam Rackoff, will screen at Mitchell Park Community Center in Palo Alto on **Sunday, October 27**.

Other films screening on Closing Night include: <u>HONG KONG - FINAL DAYS OF</u> <u>FREEDOM</u>, <u>MAKE A CIRCLE</u>, and <u>TAX WARS</u>.
